Dear Dame Minouche,

My office, the Education Division of the Taipei Representative Office in the UK, is the official representation of the Ministry of Education, Taiwan (MoE), and a department of the *de facto* embassy for Taiwan. Our responsibilities include striving to enhance educational relations between the UK and Taiwan, promoting the study of Mandarin at institutions in the UK and facilitating study abroad.

The Deputy Minister for Education in Taiwan, Mr Mon-Chi Lio, will be arriving in London later this week to attend the UK-Taiwan Higher Education Forum. The Forum will be attended by the Presidents of seventeen Taiwanese national universities as well as representatives, including Vice-Chancellors, from around thirty UK universities.
